Chairman Jenkins called the meeting to order and asked for a moment of silence followed by Maryville High School Greg Roach leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

UPDATE FROM MARYVILLE HIGH SCHOOL - Greg Roach, Principal

Greg Roach, Maryville High School principal, welcomed everyone to the Ruby Tuesday room and reported staff were using self-assessment professional development to see where they were with curriculum and iReach. MHS has seen growth in AP classes and has processes and people in place to help students through Academic Success. The focus of MHS this year is on the middle students trying to help them reach college readiness benchmarks. Mr. Roach introduced guidance counselor Kim Porter who shared the software program Naviance which helps students assess college and career readiness, discover their strengths and interests, and set and reach goals.

REPORTS FROM DIRECTOR OF SCHOOLS

Dr. Winstead introduced Jim Hinton, Cope Architecture, who gave an update on the completed

projects at Maryville High School and the renovation of the culinary arts building.

Dr. Winstead reported lots had happened since the last board meeting including SCORE Prize Summit, Rebel Ready, Eagle X games, and Hawks Olympics. He congratulated Montgomery Ridge Intermediate School principal Kevin Myers on the birth of his son. He also shared an upcoming event called Teaming for Transformation. Twenty school districts from Tennessee and Alabama will spend 2½ days in Maryville schools seeing how teachers are using technology and how students are engaged and learning with and without technology.

Coulter Grove Intermediate School 7th grader Katherine Anderson received an Honorable Mention for her artwork in the fair, as did sixth graders Alexis McNeal and Nori Blake. Maryville High School students who also participated in the TN Valley Fair art competition received the follow awards: Anna Alloway (3rd place) senior division and Kat Monleon (3rd place) sophomore division.

Maryville Junior High School Band Director Adam Ford was recently elected as the Middle Area Representative to the East TN School Band and Orchestra Association.
